
MU for Horn and Piano

first performed in concert Juliand Sch. of Music 1967 Follow path slowly. Horn: Sound pitch indicated duration indicated by lenth of black line; dot indicates stacatto. Piano: O - indicates sustained sound (until sound has faded) - indicates stacatto. Chords are constructed by figured-base notation, base-note being the pitch indicated, other pitches of chord indicated intervalically. Oster: ks indicated, other pitches of chord indicated intervalically. Oster: ks indicated by figured-base noter play arrives at an asterithe must wait for sign from other player that he two has arrived before further proceeding along path. Cicle around pitchletter: middle register. Line above: High register. Line underneath: Low register (pertains to register of instrument). Dynamics are soft throughout but differences may be determined by performers. Clarinet, trumpet or other such instruments may be substituted for horn, making proper transpotitions, t: indicate "stopped" tone (horn). Par Reborton.
